

## **CRAFTS COUNCIL APPOINT ANDREW MORLET AS NEW CHAIR**

# Andrew Morlet, Chief Executive of the Ellen MacArthur Foundation will join the board of the Crafts Council, the national charity for craft, in July 2021.

The Crafts Council have appointed Andrew Morlet to join the board as Chair of Trustees in July 2021, succeeding Professor Geoffrey Crossick who has held the role since 2013.

Andrew Morlet is Chief Executive of the Ellen MacArthur Foundation, which was established in 2010 to develop, promote and scale of the concept of a circular economy globally. He was previously a strategy consulting Partner with McKinsey & Company and Global Managing Director for Information Technology strategy with Accenture. Prior to his career in strategy consulting Andrew co-founded a design and textiles printing studio in Sydney, with prints on paper and fabric acquired for the permanent collections of the Australian National Galley, Powerhouse Museum Sydney, and Art Gallery of Western Australia.

Andrew will chair a board of 14 trustees including Yinka Ilori, Majeda Clarke, Ed Matthews-Gentle, Lady Kitt and Philip Matthews who all joined over the last few months.
