

Brookfield Properties Craft Award shortlist announced

- The Brookfield Properties Craft Award, in partnership with Crafts Council, launched in 2020, is a leading craft prize for UK artists worth £60,000
- The winning artist receives a solo exhibition at a Brookfield Properties space which will open in summer 2022
- Brookfield Properties acquires artworks by the winning artist as a gift for the national Crafts Council Collection

Today, the five artists shortlisted for the Brookfield Properties Craft Award, in partnership with the Crafts Council 2022 have been announced. They are Anthony Amoako-Attah, Dawn Bendick, Cecilia Charlton, Christian Ovonlen and Irina



Razumovskaya. The winner will be revealed on 24 February 2022 at a VIP ceremony at Somerset House, as part of Crafts Council's Collect 2022 art fair.

Now in its third year, the Brookfield Properties Craft Award is one of the most significant craft prizes in the UK, worth £60,000 to the artist and their associated gallery. The Award recognises an artist who significantly contributes to the story of contemporary craft and making in the UK.

As part of the Award, Brookfield Properties acquires the winning artist's work for the Crafts Council Collection, which currently holds over 1,700 objects. The winning artist, selected by Crafts Council and Brookfield Properties curators, will also receive a solo exhibition at a Brookfield Properties space opening in summer 2022.

The inaugural award in 2020 was won by Matt Smith, with Anna Ray winning in 2021.

The five shortlisted artists were selected from 350 artists showing at the 2022 edition of Collect, the leading international fair for contemporary design and craft. A longlist of ten artists were initially selected, which were then whittled down to the final five.

Rosy Greenlees - OBE and Executive Director of the Crafts Council, said: "It is extremely important to the craft sector to have support from companies like Brookfield Properties who truly believe in the power of craft to enliven the built environment and beyond. The Brookfield Craft Award is particularly unique as its benefit to the artist is threefold: with a solo exhibition in the heart of the City, their work becoming part of a collection of national significance and receipt of a substantial cash prize. The shortlist reflects a shared appetite of the Crafts Council and Brookfield Properties for the exciting diversity of craft being made today and I look forward to the winner being announced."

Caitlin Warfield - Vice President, Brookfield Properties, said: "We want to congratulate the five artists on being shortlisted for this year's Craft Award - their work and different practices are a true reflection of the breadth of UK craft. Arts and culture are embedded in Brookfield Properties and we are proud to be partnering with the Crafts Council on the Brookfield Properties Craft Award to celebrate contemporary makers in the UK and boost the country's national crafts heritage."

Biographies of Shortlisted Artists

About Anthony Amoako-Attah

Anthony Amoako-Attah is a PhD student in Art and Design (glass and ceramics) at the University of Sunderland, where he received an MA (glass) in 2016. He completed a BA in Industrial Art (ceramics) at Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology in Kumasi, Ghana.

Amoako-Attah's work has been exhibited at the National Glass Centre in Sunderland, and at Sunderland Museum, which commissioned him to produce an artwork for their collection in 2020. He was awarded Winner in the Aspiring Glass Artists 2020 category in Warm Glass UK's The Glass Prize and is scheduled to teach at Pilchuck Glass School in Washington during the summer of 2022.

A primarily self-taught artist, Amoako-Attah's work explores themes related to the effects of migration, dislocation, and personal identity using traditional Kente designs and Adinkra symbols from his native Ghana. Employing screen printed glass powders and kilnforming techniques, Amoako-Attah's work resembles woven or printed textiles.

About Dawn Bendick

Dawn Bendick (b. 1977, USA) is an artist working with time, light and multitone dichroic glass, based in the UK. Her project titled 'Time Over Time' considers how the changing properties of a material can signal the passage of time. She works with a combination of natural and artificial lights to trigger changes in the colour of this unusual and magical material. Her work is inspired by natural light and our intuitive ability to track time without technology. By tapping into our peripheral senses, she questions how we can bring awareness to the change in seasons, atmospheric light and weather.

Dawn's making process includes drawing, mould making, cast dichroic glass and lighting plans. Her studio is a collaborative environment in which she works with a group of experts in the field of glass making and lighting.

Bendick's work has been covered by Elle Decor, DAMN magazine, FRAME, Wallpaper, étapes and WWD(NYC). She has worked with artists and designers internationally on textiles, performances, and installations. Dawn currently resides in the UK with her partner and two young sons.

All works on view at Collect, Somerset House, with Joanna Bird Contemporary Collections are cast in collaboration with Max Jacquard Glass Studio, UK.

About Cecilia Charlton

London-based American artist Cecilia Charlton received a BFA Painting in 2015 from Hunter College in NYC, and an MA Painting from the Royal College of Art, London in 2018. She creates hand-sewn embroideries that engage with the formal histories of abstraction to explore a broad range of themes including the cosmos, memory, and current events. Through manipulations of geometric pattern and colour her artworks achieve an optically challenging and playful approach, questioning the hierarchy between painting and textiles.

Themes of feminism, human history, time and transcendence are inherently part of the hand-sewn work, and her investigation into the history of textiles from creative, cultural, and socio-economic perspectives underpins Charlton's studio practice. Spanning the mediums of textiles, installation, and art in the social sphere, the work results in conversation tending towards both the personal and the universal.

Charlton has exhibited in the UK and internationally; her recent exhibitions include: Mammoth Loop, SPACE Ilford, 2021 (solo); Aurora, Candida Stevens Gallery, 2020 (solo); Parade, curated by Kris Day, Broadway Gallery, UK, 2019; SURGE: The Eastwing Biennial, Courtauld Institute, London, 2018; Rogue Objects, curated by spaceship, University College London, London, 2018. Some awards include the Jerwood Makers Open Award in 2021; Fulbright UK Scholarship in 2015 (shortlisted), and the Ellen Battel Stockel Fellowship as part of the Yale University Norfolk Residency in 2014.

About Christian Ovonlen

Christian Ovonlen's work for Collect 2022 references Ballets Russes and theatre productions from the 19th and 20th Century, incorporating costume, scenography and dramatic lighting to create intricate and vivid marks hand painted on luxuriously hand dyed silks. Employing drawn and gestural mark making and distinctive use of colour, these complex and rich compositions result in unique works that hang vertically to reference the stages and performers from which they take their inspiration.

Ovonlen's work has been exhibited in a number of group exhibitions including 'Fashioning Space' at the Victoria and Albert museum as part of London Design Festival and 'Peckham Craft Show' for London Craft Week.

He is a member of the London based collective, Intoart.

About Irina Razumovskaya

Irina Razumovskaya (b. 1990, Leningrad, USSR) is a Russian-Israeli ceramic sculptor, recognised for her work combining architectural forms with innovative surface effects and glazing techniques. Her experimental glaze textures, that mimic the passing of time and effects of decay and dilapidation, provide glimpses into the deeper layers of meaning that can be found within our shared culture. The work serves as a critical response to a world where the vandalism of heritage and nature is becoming an everyday occurrence.

Irina graduated from both BA and MFA degrees at the Saint Petersburg Stieglitz State Academy of Art and Design, and holds an MA in Ceramics and Glass from the Royal College of Art, where she currently teaches.

She regularly is invited to participate in international exhibitions, residencies and competitions, with her recent works featured in the Mino Ceramic Competition, the British Ceramics Biennial, Korean International Ceramics Biennale, and the Loewe Craft Prize. Irina received First Prize awards from the NASPA Ceramic Talent Award (Westerwald Museum, Germany), the Biennal de Ceramics d'Esplugues, (Spain), International Triennial of Silicate Art, (Hungary), and the Carter Preston Award (Bluecoat Centre, UK). She was also awarded the D'A Special Award, Silver Medal at the 59th Faenza Prize Ceramic Competition (Italy).

Her work can be found in the collections of Chatsworth House in the UK, Mashiko Museum of Ceramic Art in Japan, the Yingge Ceramics Museum in Taiwan, and the Icheon World Ceramic Center KICB in Korea.
