### CV

Born in in 1949 in Sutton Coldfield, West Midlands, UK, Katharine Coleman is a freelance glass engraver and designer. She was taught point, drill and copper wheel engraving on glass by Peter Dreiser at Morley College, Lambeth from 1984-7 and continues to explore these techniques at her workshop at Cockpit Arts Holborn.

Two themes have long interested her – the illusion of a smaller vessel apparently suspended inside a larger one, the effect of both reflection and refraction of an engraved outer surface onto the inside surface of a thick walled clear glass vessel; also the sculptural beauty of simple natural objects, particularly the humble ones found in everyday life. Katharine is greatly influenced by the rigour and refinement of Japanese design and Japanese respect for natural, ordinary objects as being worthy of artistic interpretation.

Katharine's work requires close collaboration with glassblowers Potter Morgan Glass. She engraves on clear lead crystal forms, which have been overlaid with a thin layer of coloured glass, blown to her design. Once blown, the top surface of the glass is cut away and polished, usually with the assistance of Steve Frey at Cold Glass Workshop, so one can see inside the piece. The glass is then cut and engraved on the outside surface. The reflection of the engraving on the outside of the vessel is seen as a miniature inner vessel, although there is nothing but clear glass there. The optical properties of glass fascinate her and provide a rich world for the artist.

Katharine's work has been exhibited widely in the UK and Europe, USA and Japan and can be seen in many public collections (see below) and publications. Katharine believes wheel engraving on glass no longer needs to be traditional in style or content, though she prefers traditional techniques, using lathe-mounted copper, diamond and stone wheels, to obtain the crispness, textures and fine finish, so much more difficult to achieve with sandblast and drill.

Katharine regularly teaches glass engraving in the UK: drill, point and wheel engraving on glass at Morley College, London <u>www.morleycollege.ac.uk</u> term times on Monday mornings. From time to time she also teaches short courses in wheel, drill, sandblast and point engraving at the Bild-Werk Frauenau Summer Academy in Germany, recently in July 2016 <u>www.bild-werk-frauenau.de</u>

and at the Corning Museum Studio (next course: 21/06 - 05/07 2020). She was invited to demonstrate engraving on glass on the opening day of the GAS Conference 2016 at The Studio at Corning Museum, USA in June 2016 and to sit on the 2017 jury for the 9th International Glass Art Prize Rheinbach. Katharine is very pleased to have been invited to the joint "CoLab" conference of the Australian Glass Society and the New Zealand Glass Society at Whanganui, New Zealand, in February 2019 and to lead a workshop in glass engraving there afterwards.

Awarded an MBE for services to glass engraving in 2009, Katharine was elected an Honorary Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Glass Sellers of London and a Freeman of the City of London in June 2015. She is also an elected member of Contemporary Applied Arts, a Fellow of the Guild of Glass Engravers (2001 - 2015), a Brother of the Art Workers Guild, and member of The Glass Circle, Contemporary Glass Society and The Glass Association.

Katharine is delighted that the Glasmuseum Frauenau, Staatliches Museum zur Geschichte der Glaskultur has recently acquired her bowl *'But Where's MY Prince?'*, following an exhibition by the Glass Engraving Network of engraved glass inspired by the Grimm Brothers at Immenhausen, near Kassel, birthplace of the Grimm Brothers. In 2013, Katharine became a co-founder of this lively international network of glass engravers who have exhibited widely throughout Europe.
